Hackensack, NJ: The Lesniak Institute for American Leadership and Toys for Hospitalized Children will make their fifth New Jersey hospital visit at Joseph M. Sanzari Children's Hospital on Feb. 7 at 2 p.m.

Since its inception, Toys for Hospitalized Children has brought smiles to 950,000 children in more than 150 hospitals in 10 states with gifts and toys. Each gift is accompanied by a visit and a smile from its caring volunteers.
