Toys for Hospitalized Children was founded in 1953 for one reason, to bring smiles and healing to sick children. It is devoted to creating joy through a toy to children in hospitals, special-needs facilities, and institutions.

Since its inception in 1953, Toys for Hospitalized Children has brought smiles to 950,000 children in 150 hospitals in 10 states with gifts and toys. Each year, it distributes over 20,000 toys and gifts in over 100 children's hospitals, institutions, special needs facilities. Each gift is accompanied by a visit and a smile from one of the caring volunteers.
